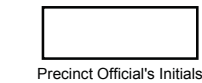

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF FORT ATKINSON BY REVISING CHAPTER 155.23, SECTION 2 REVISING THE BUILDING HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CITY OF FORT ATKINSON, IOWA.
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Fort Atkinson Iowa, as follows:
SECTION 155.23, NUMBER 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Atkinson, Iowa, 2008, is amending the following;

155.23 GARAGES AND OTHER ACCESSORY BUILDINGS
2. Maximum Size. The maximum size of a garage shall be thirty-two (32) feet by thirty-six (36) feet, and consist of a 3:12 slope in height. The maximum size of an accessory building, namely a tool or "summer" house, shall be 120 square feet of floor area.

There will be another agreement for construction of the 2nd Well.

Motion was made by K. Schmitt, seconded by Glass, to set the Public Hearing for November 4th, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center for Ordinance 22, to change building height in Chapter 155.23, section 2 to a 3:12 slope for. All Aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Glass, seconded by Schroeder, to pledge \$500 to Northeast Iowa Regional Housing Trust Fund for project match on housing updates for residents in Fort Atkinson. All Aye. Carried.

Motion was made by P. Schmitt, seconded by K. Schmitt, to approve Resolution #319 approving Adoption of the Winneshiek County Comprehensive Waste Management Plan. All Aye. Carried.

Discussed Halloween Trick or Treating for this year, and set time for 5-8pm on October 31, 2020 requesting everyone to put their porch lights on, to follow CDC guidelines, individually wrap items, and social distance as well. K. Schmitt will make posters and distribute.

Herold shared diagrams of the alley between First Street and 11th Avenue where the alley does not line up properly. Herold will take care of the cost to get a Quit Claim Deed, and has negotiated with Mark Skretta already. Herold will confirm with City Attorney if anything needs to be publicized. Motion was made by Schroeder, seconded by Leuenberger, to accept the deed for the alley, lot 2-1-3-D from Mark Skretta for purpose as an alley and proceed as needed. All Aye. Carried.

Discussed the process of cleaning up Nuisances. Johansen will draw up a letter, listing resources of who to contact to pick items up, and then we can mail out to the list P. Schmitt and Leuenberger have put together.

Appointments: Stephanie Sullivan - volunteer assistant volleyball coach and Steve Hofferf - assistant girls basketball coach 20-21 season. Resignations: none. Open Enrollments - approved. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to approve the financial reports and bills. General Fund \$40,387.65, Hot Lunch \$8,392.90, Clearing \$13,804.78, PP&L/Capital \$7,865.36. Carried unanimously.

Senior Career Students joined the board meeting and Mr. Pfaffle and FFA students updated the board on FFA happenings. FFA has 46 members. FFA is currently sponsoring fruit sales.

Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Schmitt to approve the following board representatives to the county conference boards: Don Blazek Jr. in Chickasaw County, Jody Steinlage in Fayette County and Leon Shatek in Winneshiek County. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Muetherthies to keep the school board committees as follows:

- 1) Negotiations A) Certified - Blazek & Schmitt B) Non-Certified - Shatek & Steinlage; 2) Facilities - Blazek & Schmitt 3) Transportation - Shatek & Steinlage 4) Audit/Budget - Muetherthies & Shatek. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurens told the board that our teachers and staff have been working hard with extra cleaning, teaching in the classroom and virtually, and keeping up with all of the extra Covid items this year. The President declared the hearing closed. Director Ernie Schmitt introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption. Director Leon Shatek seconded the motion to adopt. The roll was called, and the vote was: Ayes: Don Blazek Jr., Brenda Muetherthies, Ernie Schmitt, Leon Shatek, and Jody Steinlage. Nays: None

The President declared the Resolution adopted as follows: RESOLUTION TO CONTINUE PARTICIPATION IN THE INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has determined that to continue the current level of services and to fund the ongoing programs of the School District, continuation of participation in the Instructional Support Program for a period of five years is necessary and in the best interests of the District and its residents and students; and WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has given consideration to continue participation in the Instructional Support Program as provided in Sections 257.18 through 257.21, Code of Iowa; and WHEREAS, the Board has published notice of the time and place of a public hearing on the Resolution; and WHEREAS, a hearing has been held upon the proposal to continue participation in the Instructional Support Program and any objections are overruled: NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED:

1. The Board of Directors determines that it is consistent with the five-year finance plan to fund the ongoing programs and services of the School District and it is in the best interest of the School District to continue participation in an Instructional Support Program as provided in Sections 257.18 through 257.21, Code of Iowa, and to provide additional funding therefor for a period of five (5) years commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022.

2. The additional funding for the Instructional Support Program for a budget year will be determined annually and will not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and monies received under Section 257.14, Code of Iowa, as a budget adjustment for the budget year.

3. Moneys received by the District for the Instructional Support Program may be used for any general fund purpose.

4. The Instructional Support Program will be funded by instructional support state aid and an instructional support property tax levied annually upon the taxable property within the School District.

5. Unless, within twenty-eight days following the adoption of this Resolution, the Secretary of the Board receives a petition containing the signatures of eligible electors equal in number to not less than one hundred or thirty percent of the number of voters at the last preceding regular school election, whichever is greater, asking that an election be called to approve or disapprove this action of the Board adopting the Instructional Support Program, this action of the Board is final and the Secretary is authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Department of Management.

In the event a petition containing the required number of signatures is filed with the Secretary of the Board within twenty-eight days of the adoption of this Resolution, the President shall call a meeting of the Board to consider rescission of this Resolution, or to direct the county commissioner of elections to submit the following question to the qualified electors of the School District at a special election.

If the Board determines to submit the question to the electors, the proposition to be submitted shall be as follows: Shall the Board of Directors of the Turkey Valley Community School District, in the Counties of Chickasaw, Howard, Fayette, and Winneshiek, State of Iowa, be authorized for a period of five (5) years to levy annually, as determined by the Board, an instructional support property tax in an amount (after taking into consideration instructional support state aid) not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the total of regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Section 257.14, Code of Iowa, as a budget adjustment in the budget year, to be levied upon the taxable property within the School District, commencing with the levy for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, to be used for any general fund purpose? PASSED AND APPROVED this 12th day of October, 2020.

Mrs. Cuvelier shared that even with the Covid restrictions, the Homecoming festivities went well. Staff are participating in the 5-2-1-0 wellness program. The staff continues to attend inservices and professional development. Mr. Blazek thanked Mrs. Cuvelier for allowing parking at her home during the cross country meet.

Mr. Jurens told the board that our enrollment is down this year but that is in part because of a large senior class who graduated in 2020. He also told the board that Turkey Valley is in great shape financially and that we will be serving students for a long time. He also shared information from the auditors. Thanks to Janice Myers for all of her hard work on the audit and the CAR. Her efforts are greatly appreciated. The convention is virtual this year. Turkey Valley will ask all staff and students not to use the galler masks per recommendations from public health. The fall sports will be starting their post season play soon. Good luck! Mr. Jurens told the board that he has had some questions on early retirement and health insurance for para educators. He will share additional information with the board members at a later date.
