Police Lawsuit Settled

Editor A second lawsuit against a Fayette County community's police force has been settled, this time with an employee who alleged he had been retaliated against because of his homosexuality.

Fayette County court records show a motion to dismiss filed Thursday in an action filed by Daniel Moore, of Nashua, and formerly a reserve office for the City of West Union.

The motion said a settlement agreement had been reached.

The agreement follows an earlier case with former officer Sierra Fox.

Moore was recruited by Police Chief Paul Becthold under whom Moore had served as a

partment. The plaintiff alleged in a lawsuit filed in December that he had witnessed unprofession-

al conduct toward Fox on the An incident serving with

Fox also had allegedly led to criticism of Moore's conduct on the job.

"On or about December 13, 2018, Moore responded to a 911 call at the local hospital with Officer Fox, wherein Moore eventually used his taser on the patient after she lunged at Officer Fox," said a petition filed by Moore's attorney.

Moore's handling of the matter was questioned.

> low officer Moore, whose filing noted his own sexual preference, said he had been subjected to comments about those preferences on the job.

The plaintiff, who took a job for the City Sumner, was led to believe an individual applying to take the job helming that city's police force had been told of Moore's homosexuality.

Moore's lawsuit had named the City of West Union, Becthold and Nick McIntyre, the city's administrator.

Details of the settlement were not disclosed in the court filings.
