Prison Sentence Follows Animal Torture Plea

A man who entered killed dogs with an ax has been sentenced to two years in prison.

Douglass Earl Usgaard, 21, of Decorah, entered two guilty pleas on charges of animal torture - first offense and has received a sentence of \$855 fine suspended and two years in prison on each charge.

According to court records, the offenses took place Sept. 14, 2019 at a residence in the 700 block of Mound Street in Decorah.

The defendant was ordered to undergo an evaluation for mental competence.

Usgaard's prison term was ordered to be consecutive to his prison time with two guilty pleas to theft charges. He was sentenced to two years on a charge of theft - third degree with an \$855 fine suspended and 360 days in jail with a fine of \$430 for theft - fourth degree.

Upper ExplorerLand Alleges Theft Worth Over \$50,000

A complaint filed with the Winneshiek County Sheriff's Office by Upper ExplorerLand has a Spillville man facing a charge of theft – first degree.

Benjamin William Vanhorn, 32, of Spillville, is accused in a criminal complaint of receiving a loan worth \$60,000 with over \$50,000 unpaid.

According to a sworn statement with online court documents, Vanhorn used a skid loader and other construction equipment as collateral, which was then sold to another party and later to an additional party.

Man Arrested After Area Traffic Stop

One man was arrested, and another man was cited after a traffic stop Sept. 1 in West Union.

At approximately 6:15 p.m., a

deputy initiated a traffic stop near the intersection of Cherry Street and Highway 150. During a search of the vehicle, illegal substances were found.

Daniel L. Shibley, 27, of Fairbury Nebraska, was arrested for possession of a controlled substance (mariiuana) - first offense, a serious misdemeanor.

The driver of the vehicle, Austin Hatfield, 19, of Beatrice, Nebraska, was cited for not having a valid driver's license.

Sexual Misconduct Trial Set

A Fayette County man accused of sexual exploitation of a minor and dissemination of obscene material to a minor has his trial scheduled.

Tyler James Tessmer, 19, of Arlington, is accused of improper messaging and sending of photos between himself and a child.

His jury trial is set for Feb. 10, 2021.
