One man was injured Nov. 2 in an accident at approximately 6:20 p.m.
The Fayette County Sheriff's Office received 911 call of an accident in the
24000 Block of Highway 18. Austin Lee Frieden, 21, of Elgin was west-
bound on Highway 18 initiating a left hand turn into a field when a semi-
truck and trailer attempted to pass the 2019 John Deer 4365 and collided
with the unit. The driver of the semi was Dallas Gene Buhr, 71, of Eagle
Grove. Buhr was transported by ambulance to Sumner Hospital. Damage
to the 2019 John Deer spreader was estimated at \$20,000, and damage to
the 2021 Kenworth X6 Semi amounted to a total loss. The Fayette County
Sheriff's Office was assisted by Waucoma fire department and Tri-State

**Semi Flips, Spill
Contaminates
Area Stream**

A crash Nov. 1 at approx-
imately 1:57 p.m. had Fayette
County deputies called to a semi
rollover just north of 10879 D
Avenue. A trailer was on its side
when law enforcement arrived.

The content of the trailer
was identified as fertilizer, which
had spilled into a stream. Clete
Christianson, 61, of Elgin, was
southbound on D Avenue when
he over-corrected the steering
wheel, causing the trailer to tip
over. The tractor and trailer skid-
ded across the center line, end-
ing in the east ditch.

Due to chemicals spilling into
the stream, the Iowa DNR was
called in to investigate and as-
sist in the cleanup. The Fayette
County Sheriff's office was as-
sisted by Arlington Fire and EMS,

along with Emergency Manage-
ment Services and Iowa DNR.

**Burglar Caught in
The Act Sentenced**

A West Union man who was
helping himself to the content's
of another man's garage when
the owner walked in has received
a five-year suspended prison
term.

Dakota Dale Voves, 29, of
West Union, entered a guilty plea
following the incident that origi-
nally took place in January in the
200 block of East Maple Street in
West Union.

According to a statement by
Chief Paul Bechthold, Voves en-
tered a garage around 7:30 a.m.
and started shoving items in his
pockets and making a pile of oth-
er items he wanted to steal.

The owner returned home
and found Voves, who handed
back a few items and left. Then,
the owner discovered more was
still missing.

Voves also received five
years of probation and a sus-
pended fine of \$750 and was
ordered to pay restitution.

Living just a block from the
West Union Residential Facility,
Voves was additionally ordered
to spend up to one year in resi-
dential facility care.

**Traffic Stop Leads
to Two Arrests**

A routine traffic stop for an
equipment violation ended up
with two men arrested.

At approx. 1:50 a.m. Nov.
4, a Fayette County deputy
stopped a vehicle on Highway
150 near Clark St. in Fayette.
The driver, Skylar Battaglia 19,
of Cedar Rapids, was arrested
and charged with driving while
suspended, no insurance and

failure to maintain seat belt and
was also issued two warnings for
equipment violations.

The passenger, Shea C.
Henderson 26, of Cedar Rapids,
was also arrested for interfer-
ence with official acts and failure
to maintain use of safety belt.

Law enforcement also dis-
covered Henderson had an ac-
tive warrant for his arrest from
the North Liberty Police Depart-
ment for Burglary – first degree,
and there was no bond.

**Decorah Woman
Facing 4 Felonies
Has Trial Date Set**

A woman accused of being
a felon in possession of multiple
guns while she was at a house
being searched for stolen prop-
erty and drugs will be going to trial.

Destiny L. Chambers, 39, of
Decorah, was in a Clermont resi-
dence Sept. 24 when members
of law enforcement arrived to
search for stolen property.

Deputies began to find drugs
as well in their search and ob-
tained another search warrant
that allowed them to search for
drugs.

Chambers was find with
a pipe in her possession with
methamphetamine residue, and
a bag at the residence, identified
by someone at the house as be-
long to Chambers, was found to
contain two guns.

She is charged with four
felonies include two counts of
having a firearm while a felon,
possession of a controlled sub-
stance – third or subsequent
offense and gathering where
controlled substance are used,
all Class "D" felonies.

A trial date of Feb. 17, 2021,
at 9:30 a.m., has been set for
Chambers.
