ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION FROM A-1 AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO A-R AGRICULTURAL RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT FOR THE HEREIN DESCRIBED PROPERTY.
WHEREAS, a request for amendment to the zoning ordinance of Winneshiek County was submitted to the Planning and Zoning Commission, said request having been acted upon by the Planning and Zoning Commission following a public hearing; and,
WHEREAS, the request for amendment of the zoning ordinance pertains to the following described real estate:
Lots 1 of 4, 3 of 3, and 2 of 2 of 1 of 5 of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter, of Section 3, Township 96 North, Range 7 West of the 5th P.M. Winneshiek County, Iowa.
WHEREAS, the said zoning request requested that the property be rezoned from A-1 Agricultural District to A-R Agricultural Residential District; and,
WHEREAS, a notice of the time and place of a public hearing on said request was published pursuant to law; and,
WHEREAS, a public hearing as required has been conducted by the Winneshiek County Board of Supervisors.
WHEREAS, the Winneshiek County Board of Supervisors has considered the Winneshiek County Comprehensive Plan in their review of the Applicant's request and does find that the request is consistent with the policies and goals set out in the Winneshiek County Comprehensive Plan; and,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE WINNESHIK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:
1. That the zoning classification as to the following described real estate:
Lots 1 of 4, 3 of 3, and 2 of 2 of 1 of 5 of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter, of Section 3, Township 96 North, Range 7 West of the 5th P.M. Winneshiek County, Iowa.
is hereby changed from A-1 Agricultural District to A-R Agricultural Residential District.
2. That the zoning map of Winneshiek County, Iowa, be modified to reflect this change.
Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this zoning ordinance or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.
Severability Clause. If any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 403
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 92 AND 99 IN ORDER TO ESTABLISH RATE ADJUSTMENT PROVISIONS AND INCREASED MINIMUM SEWER CHARGES FOR THE CITY OF CALMAR, IOWA.
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calmar, Iowa, as follows:
1. That Chapter 92 – Water Rates – of the Municipal Code of the City of Calmar is hereby amended by adding thereto Section 92.09 the following:
92.09 – 92.03 Rate Adjustments.
Each year before July 1st, the basic water minimum will raise \$ 1.00 per year (for 2018,2019,2020,2021,2022) in addition before the 1st day of July of each year, the City Clerk shall compute an adjustment to the water rates based upon the multiplication of the current rate by a factor equal to the increase in the Consumer Price Index (C.P.I.). This adjustment shall be submitted to the council. This increase shall go into effect on July 1 of each year and shall appear in the first billing after the start of the fiscal year.
2. That Chapter 99 – Sewer Service Charges of the Municipal Code of the City of Calmar is hereby amended by revising Section 99.02 and adding Section 99.08 the following:
99.02. Rate.
Each dwelling unit, apartment unit, mobile home, house, business and industry shall be considered as one sewer account and shall pay a base rate of \$32.50 per month for sanitary sewer service. The Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC) shall pay a base rate of \$650.00 (20 units) per month for sanitary sewer service. The South Winneshiek Community School shall pay a base rate of \$227.50 (7 units) per month for sanitary sewer service.
1. Every customer or account shall also pay a sanitary sewer usage fee of \$6.50 per month for each one thousand (1,000)

gallons of wastewater treated by the City.
In no case shall the minimum charge be less than \$32.50 per month, which is necessary to retire the indebtedness, operating and maintenance and reserve necessary for maintaining the sanitary sewer facility.
99.08. Rate Adjustments.
Before the 1st day of July of each year, the City Clerk shall compute an adjustment to the sewer rates based upon the multiplication of the current rate by a factor equal to the increase in the Consumer Price Index (C.P.I.). This adjustment shall be submitted to the council. This increase shall go into effect on July 1 of each year and shall appear in the first billing after the start of the fiscal year.
Severability Clause. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
When Effective. This Ordinance shall be in effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Absent: None
Mayor Paul Herold called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
Jerry and Maxwell Krivachek requested a letter from the City for a Recyclers License, stating they are in compliance with the space of their shop meeting at least the 14 x 24 standard. Krivachek advised they will do all the fixing inside the shop.
Only 2-3 cars will sit on the lot by Shatek's, and anything else will go to a remote location off the premises. All parts will be stored inside. Hours of operation meet the standard. Motion was made by Schneider, seconded by Glass to approve their request. All Aye. Carried.
Ron Franzen requested Mayor Herold's signature on a grant application through the DNR for 4 new pagers and 4 links of fire hoses. Discussed the Legion Memorial renovation, of which he is still looking for someone to provide a conceptual drawing. Barta will contact Al Boeckenhauer in Calmar.
Barta advised Turkey Valley School contacted him to sweep their parking lot. After some discussion, Ron Franzen mentioned using a broom on a Skidloader. Council prefers they go that route. Barta worked with the adjuster on the items missed from the haulstorm, and is waiting on response. He attended the Turkey River Watershed meeting and the discussion was to remove the gauges at Spillville. Herold explained we would not want that to happen, as it gives an early warning to the properties downstream to better prepare in a flood situation. They will be meeting again later to try and get the Iowa Flood Service and National Weather Service to better partner on the information on the website.
Motion was made by Glass, seconded by Schroeder, to approve September 6, 2017 Minutes, Clerk's Reports, and Monthly Bills as presented. All Aye. Carried.
No update as discussion continues on proximity of new location to move the sewer lagoons to. Herold advised Council he received an email that FEMA approved \$7mm for Flood Mapping, so hopefully we can get the City's updated. Discussed purchasing a trash pump. Greg will look into cost.
Iowa DOT placed Speed Trailers and all of the Council felt they could see a difference in the speed of traffic through town. Council would like to apply for a grant to purchase permanent signs.
No new permits were submitted.
Al Becker has decided not to continue on the Community Foundation Grant committee. Council will seek his replacement at next meeting.
Next meeting will be Wednesday, November 1, 2017, at 7pm. K. Schmitt made

a motion to adjourn, Glass seconded. All Aye. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:18 p.m.

64. Vehicles traveling north on West street shall stop at W. Lewis Street
65. Vehicles traveling south on West street shall stop at W. Lewis Street
66. Vehicles traveling east in the alley between Lewis & Henry Street must stop at N. Charles Street.
53. Vehicles traveling north on West Street shall stop at its intersection with W. Main Street
54. Vehicles traveling south on West Street shall stop at its intersection with W. Main Street
2. REPEALER. All ordinances or part of ordinances, insofar as they are in direct conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional such adjudication shall not effect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

OCTOBER 2, 2017
Mayor Keith Frana called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. on October 2, 2017, at the Calmar Fire Station. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Present were: Sabelka, Klevé, Schissel, Kirkeberg and Ondrashek.
There were no comments or questions from the public. Mayor Keith Frana addressed his condolences to the victims and their families in the Las Vegas shooting which just took place.
Motioned by Schissel, second by Kirkeberg to approve the consent agenda (agenda, minutes of September 5, 2017, CDBG/treasurer reports and claims for September 2017). Aye: Klevé, Sabelka, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.
Diana Johnson from Upper Explorerland presented a contract between the City of Calmar and UERP administration for administering the CDBG grant.
Motioned by Schissel, second by Klevé to approve contract for services between Upper Explorerland Regional Planning Commission and the City of Calmar (CDBG-Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements) . Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
Presented for approval was resolution # 583 adopting the following: Code of Conduct; Procurement Policy; RARA; Equal Opportunity Policy Statement; Excessive Force; Affirmative Action Program and Affirmative Fair Housing Policy. Motioned by Sabelka, second by Kirkeberg to approve Resolution # 584 required by CDBG rules. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
CDBG environmental documents This will start 30 days from October 3, 2017.
TJ Schissel presented the Fire Department report for the month of September. The Department was pretty quiet. They held their business meeting on the 12th and their training on the 25th which consisted of the tanker operation procedures. The only page for the month was for a truck fire and there were a total of 48 volunteer hours for the month of September. Schissel also mentioned the soup supper this Saturday, October 7 followed by the truck parade.
Chief Ward presented the Police Department report for the month of September. He gave the statistics for the month and talked about the October 10th "Let's Talk About It" being held at the Train Station at 9 a.m. for the public to attend. There was also discussion about our speed trailer and the recall on Chief Ward's vehicle. Matt Bullerman presented the street department report in absence of Junior Boyer. He said they have been working on the approach and sidewalk outside the library and City of Calmar office. Matt also stated that they have most of the new stop signs in place and have recently sealed the Freedom Rock.
TJ Schissel addressed a drainage problem by Nick Schissel and Keith Gerlich's property. Matt stated that the storm drains were cleaned out. Options to fix the problem were discussed.
Matt Bullerman presented the water/wastewater report. He said that he will be flushing hydrants this week and working on our well (Michele is still waiting to hear back from our insurance carrier on this project). Matt also said that Municipal Pipe & Tool has been cleaning some lines; We post on Facebook as soon as we can for the public.
Brian Ondrashek reported on the Park and Rec. He said they are meeting monthly now, so the next meeting is this Thursday, October 5. Brian also said that their Capital Campaign was a success. And that they are trying to have some adult activities too. There was also some discussion on an employee manual for Blake. It was suggested to look at other town Rec programs to get some different ideas.
Don Wurtzel reported that there was a Planning & Zoning meeting last Wednesday, September 27 and the members have some recommendations for the City Council (prepared by Rick Zahasky). These are Ag land to I1, R1 to R2, and a building permit process.
There was no City Engineer report due to the absence of George Tekippe.
Mayor Keith Frana had nothing to report. Motion by Schissel, second by Sabelka to approve the third and final reading of Ordinance #403 raising the water and sewer rates. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek and Sabelka. Motion carried. These rates will go into effect on the next billing cycle.
Motion by Klevé, second by Kirkeberg to approve Ordinance #405 stop signs. Motion by Klevé, second by Kirkeberg to waive the additional readings. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
The Annual Urban Renewal Report was reviewed. Motion by Sabelka, second by Schissel to approve. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Klevé to approve Resolution #584 approving internal loan from DS to TIF. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
PPE#3 for Bacon Construction (Huber Drive) in the amount of \$4,424.62 was

presented for approval. Motion by Schissel, second by Sabelka to approve. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
Motion by Schissel, second by Kirkeberg to approve contract change order for Huber Drive \$ -1,302.42. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek, and Sabelka. Motion carried.
Motion by Schissel, second by Sabelka to set the date for a public hearing on the recommendations from the Planning & Zoning Board regarding zoning changes for November 6, 2017, at 5:30 p.m. at the Calmar Fire Station. Aye: Klevé, Kirkeberg, Schissel, Ondrashek and Sabelka. Motion carried.
