



The Board of Supervisors met at 9:30 a.m. July 6, 2020, with Logsdon, Thompson, and Ashbacher in person and Kuhn and Beard present electronically.

Dan Marx, County Sheriff, met with the Board. He reviewed the jail project and the FY20 and FY21 budgets. He requested to begin the hiring process for an additional deputy with a target hire date sometime in November or December. Moved by Kuhn and seconded by Beard to begin the process to get an additional deputy hired. Motion carried unanimously.

Doug Groux, County Sanitarian, met with the Board to review the Bohr Dairy plans for expansion. Moved by Kuhn and seconded by Thompson to approve the DNR application for the Bohr Dairy operation. Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Kuhn and seconded by Thompson to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes of the last meeting, the Class C with outdoor and Sunday sales beer/wine permit for McCaffrey's Dolce Vita and to accept and file the quarterly report of the County Auditor. Motion carried unanimously.

Isaac Wiltgen, Assistant County Engineer, met with the Board to discuss road matters.

Moved by Thompson and seconded by Ashbacher to approve the Asset Sale Agreement with Pheasants Forever for

an extra seed drill. Motion carried unanimously.

Krista Vanden Brink, Public Health Director, met with the Board to give COVID-19 updates.

Wendy Stevens, Planning and Zoning Commission Chair, met with the Board to discuss the work a sub-committee of P&Z has accomplished on the potential changes to the P&Z Ordinance for Resource Protection Districts. She will take the discussion topics back to the sub-committee and the P&Z Commission to start the process of hearings and adoption of the proposed updates.

The Board discussed the Burr Oak Sewer project, and expects actionable items related to the project at a meeting in the near future. Moved by Beard and seconded by Thompson to approve the Administration Agreement with Upper Explorerland Regional Planning Commission for billings and reporting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Turkey Valley School Board met in a work session on Monday, July 13, 2020. The meeting was held at the football bleachers construction site. Don Blazek Jr. called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The following Board Directors answered roll call: Leon Shatek, Don Blazek Jr., Ernie Schmitt and Jody Steinlage. Brenda Mueterthies was absent. The school board along with members of the Turkey Valley Athletic Boosters met to discuss the drainage issues around the bleacher project. Ideas for solutions were discussed including the additional costs to complete the bleacher project and a drainage plan. Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Schmitt to adjourn at 7:00 p.m. Carried unanimously.

The Turkey Valley School Board met in a regular session on Monday, July 13, 2020. The meeting was held in the Elementary Media Center at Turkey Valley School, Jackson Junction, IA. Don Blazek, Jr. called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. The following Board Directors answered roll call: Leon Shatek, Don Blazek Jr., Ernie Schmitt and Jody Steinlage. Brenda Mueterthies was absent. Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Steinlage to approve the agenda as presented. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Shatek to approve the consent agenda items. Board Minutes: June 8, 2020, regular meeting. Appointments: Amy Baumer - Custodian (effective July 13, 2020); Resignations: Raquel Schmitt - Associate. Open Enrollments - none. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to approve the financial reports and bills. General Fund \$73,431.02, Hot Lunch \$238.56, Clearing \$27,584.68, PPEL/Capital \$53,844.59. Carried unanimously.

There was no public forum nor were there any unfinished business items. The school board discussed the football

bleacher project and the water issues around that area. The board would like to see a wall with railings installed on both sides of the bleachers. A system of intakes, pipes and culverts will be installed to direct water away from the bleachers. Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to approve that the board will pay \$3,000.00 towards implementing the drainage system. The board felt that this portion of the project was the responsibility of the school. The board is willing to pay 50/50 for the walls and railings portion of the project. The cost of the sidewalks remains the TVAB's responsibility. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurens told the board that the Return to Learn plan has been submitted but it is still a work in progress. The committee has done a great job and has spent many hours discussing what is best for Turkey Valley students, staff and families. The goal is to get the students back to school but we need to do it the safest way possible. The staff needs to feel comfortable as well as the students and their families. The final plan won't be ready until the first part of August.

Steve Crawford inspected the roof at Turkey Valley and found an area that is holding water and it needs to be repaired/replaced. He submitted a bid from Moss Roofing so that the board would have an idea of cost to repair/replace. The board would like to have a second bid including availability of the company to complete the project before school starts. Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to table this item until another bid and additional information could be acquired. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Steinlage to approve the following IASB Legislative Priorities: #3 Preschool, #4 Early Literacy, #18 School Funding Policy, and #25 Unfunded Mandates. Carried unanimously.

There are two yellow flashing warning lights on Hwy 24. One on the east end and one on the west side. These lights flash before and after school to warn traffic of the school zone. One light was purchased

by the town of Jackson Junction and Turkey Valley is responsible for the other light. Currently neither light is working. The programming for these lights requires someone to go into the ditch and connect a computer to the light and enter dates and times that we would like the lights to flash for the school year. If for instance there is an early out due to weather, someone would need to go into the ditch, hook up the computer and tell the light to flash at the new dismissal time. This is not practical, nor is it safe. Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to table this item until Mr. Jurens can talk with the Jackson Junction City Council to see if they would be willing to help pay for a portion of these lights including a remote programming system. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to approve the Iowa State University Field Experience Contract for 2020-2021. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to approve the depository banks for the 2020-2021 school year with the maximum amount that can be deposited in each as follows: Bank Iowa, Lawyer - \$6,000,000, Citizens' Savings Bank of Fort Atkinson - \$200,000 and the Bank of the West, Decorah - \$200,000. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to approve the sharing of April Schmitt for the Family and Consumer Science teacher with New Hampton for 2 periods per day. This is pending if both schools can make it work into their scheduling. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Steinlage to approve the 2020-2021 Insurance Renewal and the Equipment Breakdown Coverage Renewal. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Steinlage to approve Don Blazek Jr., board president, to sign checks in the clearing and lunch accounts effective July 2020 and adding Renee Cuvelier to the signature line for checks in the clearing and lunch accounts effective August 1, 2020. Remove Carol Knoll's permission to

sign checks effective July 1, 2020. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to approve Winneshiek Medical Center Trainers Contract for 2020-2021. If there is no season for a certain sport will there be a refund? Carried unanimously.

There are some tools and items from the shop classroom that will be up for sale. Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Shatek to post these items on social media and hold a silent auction for them. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Shatek and seconded by Schmitt to table the 2020-2021 Handbook item. This will give Mrs. Cuvelier a chance to read over the handbooks and ask questions before a final book is approved. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Steinlage and seconded by Shatek to table the late open enrollment request. Mr. Jurens will try to get additional information for the next board meeting. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Jurens told the board that the open enrollment from last month has been settled. The sale of the excess items in June profited approximately \$350.00. The new Turkey Valley App is up and going. This will be a great source of communication for parents and patrons. Turkey Valley received a number of CTE Modules from New Hampton. These will help us meet our FCS requirement for the 7th and 8th grade levels. Turkey Valley plans to do online registration again this year and we are hoping to have the pay online option in place. Mr. Jurens welcomed Mrs. Renee Cuvelier to the meeting and thanked her for attending. Her official first day is August 1, 2020.

The next regular school board meeting will be Monday, August 10, 2020, @ 7:00 p.m.

Moved by Schmitt and seconded by Steinlage to adjourn at 8:27 p.m. Carried unanimously.
