The Board of Supervisors met at 9:30 a.m. May 28, 2019, with all members present.

Moved by Thompson and seconded by Ashbacher to open the public hearing on the proposed FY19 Budget Amendment. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. No written or verbal comments were received. Moved by Kuhn and seconded by Beard to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. Moved by Kuhn and seconded by Thompson to adopt resolutions 19-57, 19-58, and 19-59; amending the budget as published, appropriating the amended budget dollars to the departments, and amending the road department construction program accordingly. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Barb Schroeder, Conservation Director, met with the Board to review her FY19 budget. She requested the Board consider transferring the remainder of the Conservation Budget for FY19 to the Conservation Capital Fund to be designated for development at the Neste Valley Recreation Area. The Board asked her to come back later in June with an actual dollar figure before they approve it.

Lee Bjerke, County Engineer, met with the Board to discuss road matters.

Moved by Ashbacher and seconded by Kuhn to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes of the last meeting, the claims filed with the Board, and the Class C beer/wine permit for Highland General Store. Motion carried unanimously.

Kuhn was absent for the remainder of the meeting.

Moved by Beard and seconded by Thompson to approve the 28E agreement with Winneshiek County Development Inc for the County to be the Employer of Record for the WCDI Director. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed the job description for the Jail Administrator. They recommended a few additional changes to the Sheriff and will act on the approval at a future meeting.

Moved by Thompson and seconded by Ashbacher to adjourn to 9:30 a.m. Monday, June 3, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

County Committee Member Nominations Opening

USDA's Farm Service Agency will begin accepting nominations for county committee members Friday. Agricultural producers who participate or cooperate in an FSA program may be nominated for candidacy for the county committee. Individuals may nominate themselves or another as a candidate.

"I encourage America's farmers, ranchers, and forest stewards to nominate candidates to lead, serve, and represent their community on their county committee," said Richard Fordyce, FSA administrator. "There's an increasing need for diverse representation including un-

derstood producers, which includes beginning, women and minority farmers and ranchers."

Committees make important decisions about how federal farm programs are administered locally. Their input is vital on how FSA carries out disaster programs, as well as conservation, commodity and price support programs, county office employment and other agricultural issues.

Nationwide, over 7,700 dedicated members of the agricultural community serve on FSA county committees. The committees are made of three to 11 members and typically meet once a month.

Members serve three-year terms. Producers may visit their local FSA offices to find out how to get involved in their county's elections. Organizations may also nominate candidates.

To be considered, a producer must sign an FSA-669A nomination form. The form and other information about FSA county committee elections are available at fsa.usda.gov/elections. All nomination forms for the 2019 election must be postmarked or received in the local FSA office by Aug. 1.

Election ballots will be mailed to eligible voters beginning Nov. 4.

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION FROM A-1 AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO R-2 UNINCORPORATED RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT FOR THE HEREIN DESCRIBED PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, a request for amendment to the zoning ordinance of Winneshiek County was submitted to the Planning and Zoning Commission, said request having been acted upon by the Planning and Zoning Commission following a public hearing; and,

WHEREAS, the request for amendment of the zoning ordinance pertains to the following described real estate:

Lots 1 of 1 and 2 of 1 of the East 30 acres of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 13, of Township 98 North, Range 8 West of the 5th P.M. Winneshiek County, Iowa.

WHEREAS, the said zoning request requested that the property be rezoned from A-1 Agricultural District to R-2 Unincorporated Residential District; and,

WHEREAS, a notice of the time and place of a public hearing on said request was published pursuant to law; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing as required has been conducted by the Winneshiek County Board of Supervisors.

WHEREAS, the Winneshiek County Board of Supervisors has considered the Winneshiek County Comprehensive Plan in their review of the Applicant's request and does find that the request is consistent with the policies and goals set out in the Winneshiek County Comprehensive Plan; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WINNESHIEK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

That the zoning classification as to the following described real estate:

Lots 1 of 1 and 2 of 1 of the East 30 acres of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 13, of Township 98 North, Range 8 West of the 5th P.M. Winneshiek County, Iowa, is hereby changed from A-1 Agricultural District to R-2, Unincorporated Residential District.

That the zoning map of Winneshiek County, Iowa, be modified to reflect this change.

Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this zoning ordinance or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Severability Clause. If any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication as provided by law.
