BOARD MINUTES MONDAY **NOVEMBER 8, 2021** THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MET AT 9:30AM NOVEMBER 8, 2021 WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

Dan Marx, County Sheriff, met with the Board to introduce Logan Hopp, his appointment as a new Deputy. Moved by Vick and seconded by Rustad to adopt resolution 22-21, approving the appointment of Logan Hopp as Deputy Sheriff. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. Dave Ondrashek, Sumner Township Clerk, met with the Board to review the plans for the new Fire Station in Protivin. Sumner Township utilizes the Protivin Fire Department for fire protection services. Their share of the project, \$140,000, is 20% of the total cost. They have saved tax revenue and done some fundraising but are still short about \$60,000. They are requesting fund-ing from the Board of Supervisors \$60,000 to cover their share.

Moved by Vermace and seconded by Rustad to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes

of the last meeting, the claims filed with the Board and to accept and file the monthly report of the County Recorder. Motion carried unanimously. The Board held the second reading of the proposed re-zoning Ordi-

nance for the Omar property. The Board accepted public comments on the proposed ordinance. Moved by Vermace and seconded by Beard to waive the third reading. Motion carried unanimously. Moved by Vermace and seconded by Vick to adopt the proposed ordinance. Motion failed by roll call vote with Vick and Langreck voting aye; and Beard, Vermace, and Rustad voting nay.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION TO INSTITUTE PROCEED-INGS TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AGREEMENT AND TO BORROW MONEY THEREUNDER IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$76.000 (SEWER REVENUE)

The Board of Supervisors of Winneshiek County, Iowa, will meet Nov. 29, 2021, at the Courthouse Annex, Decorah, Iowa, at 9:40 o'clock a.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Aareement") and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$76,000, for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of planning, designing, and constructing improvements and extensions to the Sanitary Sewer System (the "Utility") of the County, including the construction of improvements to the Burr Oak Wastewater Treatment Facility.

The Loan Agreement will not constitute a general obligation of the County, nor will it be payable in any manner by taxation, but, together with the County's outstanding Sewer Revenue Note, dated April 12, 1993; Sewer Revenue Notes, dated April 26, 2000; Taxable Sewer Revenue Note, Series 2019, dated February 13, 2019 and any additional obligations of the County as may be hereafter issued and outstanding from time to time ranking on a parity therewith, will be payable solely and only from the net revenues of the Utility.

At the aforementioned time and place, oral or written objections may be filed or made to the proposal to enter into the Loan Agreement. After receiving objections, the County may determine to enter into the Loan Agreement, in which case, the decision will be final unless appealed to the District Court within fifteen (15) days thereafter.
