Mayor Frana called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M. on January 3, 2022 at the Calmar Fire Station. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Present were: Kleve, Schissel, Sabelka, Kirkeberg and Gerlich. Also present were: Mayor Frana, Don Wurtzel, Sheila Bullerman, Bill Klimesh and Mike Hohenbrink.

Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Schissel to approve the consent agenda (agenda, minutes of December 6, 2021, clerk/treasurer reports, claims for December 2021, BC0031071 Calmar Redemption Center). Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Kleve, Kirkeberg and Gerlich. Motion carried.

There were no comments or questions from the public.

Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Schissel to approve building permit for Daniel Timp at 301 S Charles Street pending Calmar Zoning Board of Adjustments meeting regarding the variances. Aye: Kleve, Sabelka, Gerlich, Kirkeberg and Schissel. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel, second by Sabelka to approve Resolution #649 ordering bids, notice to bidders, fixing amount of bid security, and ordering clerk to publish notice and fixing a date for receiving same, and for a public hearing on plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of costs for the construction of the "Maple Street Utility Replacement Project" for the City of Calmar, Iowa. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Kirkeberg, Kleve and Gerlich. Motion carried.

Motion by Kleve, second by Gerlich to set the date for a public hearing toward the contract of the Maple Street Replacement Project for the City of Calmar, Iowa (February 7, 2022). Aye: Kleve, Sabelka, Schissel, Kirkeberg and Gerlich. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel, second by Sabelka to set the date for a public hearing for the 2022 proposed property tax levy (February 7, 2022). Aye: Kleve, Sabelka, Schissel, Kirkeberg and Gerlich. Motion carried.

The council received a request and recommendation from the Zoning Board to change the zoning designation of the parcels below from A-1 to I-1.

Mayor Frana announced this was the time and place set for a public hearing to rezone Lot 1 of 1 of 2 of 1 of 3 and Lot 2 of 1 of 2 of 1 of 3, both in the E ½-SW ¼ of Section 26 – T97N – R9W, City of Calmar, Winneshiek County, Iowa, containing 5.3 acres, from A-1 Agriculture to I-1 Industrial. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Motion by Schissel, second by Kirkeberg to approve Ordinance #447 rezoning from A-1 to I-1 above description (2nd and 3rd readings waived). Aye: Schissel, Kleve, Sabelka, Kirkeberg and Gerlich. Motion carried.

The council received a request and recommendation from the Zoning Board to change the zoning designation of the parcels below from R-2 to C-1.

Mayor Frana announced this was the time and place set for a public hearing to rezone Lot 1, 2, 3 & Lot 4, Exc W25' of S17' & vac alley exc W25' all in blk 46 (west section of parcel 142648400800 zoned R-2), City of Calmar, Winneshiek County, Iowa, from R-2 Residential to C-1 General Commercial. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The approval of Ordinance #448 rezoning from R-2 to C-1 above description was tabled at this time.

The Fire Department report was in the packet. They held their business meeting December 14. There were three pages with 16.5 volunteer hours donated for the month.

The Police Department report was in the packet.

Motion by Sabelka, second by Gerlich to purchase a 2006 generator for our northeast lift station. Aye: Kleve, Sabelka, Gerlich, Kirkeberg and Schissel. Motion carried.

Mayor Frana commented on the positives of using the CAT payloader for pushing snow. Schissel said the city employees did a great job.

Motion by Sabelka, second by Schissel to approve a yearly contribution of \$6,000 to the SW Rec Program starting 7/1/22-6/30/23. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Gerlich, Kleve and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Kirkeberg and Gerlich were going to get together to work on pool details for the summer of 2022 (manager, wages, et al.).

Don Wurtzel, Economic Development, commented on the approval of the USDA grant, police in car camera grant that will be finalized this week, and the new grants for the Fire Department and Senior Citizen Center.

Motion by Schissel, second by Gerlich to approve the Mayor Appointment 2022, Appoint Mayor Pro Tem (Dennis Kleve) and the Calmar Courier as our official newspaper. Aye: Kleve, Kirkeberg, Gerlich, Sabelka and Schissel. Motion carried.

Mayor Frana reported that our attorney is working on the Soo Green project and one of our nuisance properties. There will be a For Sale sign placed on the part of Webster Street between Blocks 44 and 45 in the Town of Calmar, Winneshiek County, Iowa.

Moved by Beard and seconded by Vick to open the public hearing on the vacation of a portion of Landmeyer Road. Motion carried unanimously. The initial request by one landowner was to vacate the whole road. Landowner Tom Erickson was present and requested that the portion adjacent to his property remain a public road, but he was okay with the vacation of the remainder after his property. He also was willing to work with the Engineer to put in a turn-around area at the end of his property for the road maintainer.
